The proposed fee-to-trust property is in unincorporated Kings County adjacent to the Santa Rosa Rancheria and approximately 1.7 miles southeast of the City of Lemoore.

Based on the analysis and impacts in a previously released Environmental Assessment (EA) and the entire administrative record, the BIA is issuing a FONSI.
